While a Step well as the name indicates is constructed sometimes 5 to 7storey deep with lots of steps to reach the well to harvest rain water.

Ans6. Water harvesting is the technique of collecting, storing and using rainwater for irrigation, drinking and other purposes.

Ans7.Rain water harvesting saves rainwater from getting drained and wasted by collecting it in rain water tanks. Thus, It solves the problem of water scarcity.

- Travelling in modern times is very convenient as different means of transport are available such as cars, buses, trains, aeroplanes or ships.
- Many guest houses, restaurants, night shelters, motels and hotels provide comfort and safety to the travellers.
- Better roads, bridges and flyovers ensure the smooth movement of vehicles.

In older times

- While in older times no proper modes of transport were available.
- Traveling was time consuming due to slow means of transport and bad or poor roads.
- Options of guest houses, restaurants, night shelters, motels and hotels was also not available to travelers. Hence traveling was not very safe and comfortable.
