Parent-Teacher Focus Committee

The DAV-PTFC (Parent Teacher Focus Committee) is a body constituting representatives of Parents and Staff of DAV. The list of parent & staff representatives of the PTFC for the one academic year & the schedule of meetings will be available.

Objectives of the PTFC

The objectives of the PTFC are to advance the education, all-round development of the students and to act as a link between the parents of each of their respective classes and the teachers as well as to bring to the notice any issues by deepening and extending relationships between Teachers, Parents.

Constitution of PTFC

- 1. Membership to PTFC is for one academic year only i.e. from July to March.
 - Membership of PTFC are Parents / guardians whose children or wards attend school.
 - Three Parents & three Teachers from each section in the Academic Focus Committee.
 - ThreeParents & three / four Teachers representing the other Focus Committees.
 - The membership is subject to approval of the Principal.
- 2. Senior most Teacher will be the Head/ Convenor of the committee.
- PTFC further divided into various Focus committees so that maximum representation of parents & suggestions to improve can be explored & implemented.
- 4. The focus committees is as follows
 - Academic:
 - i. It is divided into four sections :
 - ii. Pre-Primary Section,
 - iii. Classes 1st to 4th,
 - iv. Classes 5th to 7th,
 - v. Classes 8th to 10+2.

- Sports / Games
- Sanitation / Safety & Traffic Control in Campus
- Art / Culture / Music
- Resource Persons / Field Trips & Excursion

Roles and Responsibility of the PTFC

- The PTFC will meet as per the schedule available on notice board in the school & make suggestions towards achieving the objective stated above. The suggestions put up by the PTFC, once approved by the Principal in consultation with the school management will be implemented by the PTFC & the school.
- The Board of Management of DAV may at its sole discretion modify the objectives, roles & responsibilities of PTFC from time to time.

Code of Conduct:

- All PTFC meetings will be held only on the school campus during school hours. Detailed schedule is as provided
- No meeting will be held under auspices of the PTFC outside the school or in a public place without the prior written approval of the Principal.
- The name of the PTFC and the names of any PTFC members shall not be used in connection with any commercial interest.

Dissolution of PTFC

The PTFC will be automatically dissolved at the end of the academic year (the last meeting will be held in March of each academic year).

- Explain your goals for the child and how each student's progress is determined.
- Talk about Child's work. Discuss the child's performance in each subject.
- Listen to parents; it will help you understand what they want for their child.
- Close the meeting by setting goals for the child's future work.
- Suggest strategies for meeting those goals.

NEED OF PTA

Need for conduction of PTA meetings in the schools are many and some of them are listed below:-

- It improves home-school communication by providing two way communication between parents and teachers.
