Guidelines :

Children learn a lot from their parents who are child's first teachers. You are suggested to be role models for your children in respect to your actions and words

- Parents Teacher Meeting should be attended Regularly in order to get apprised of the progress of the ward.
- 2. Parents should always carry their identity card to the school.
- 3. Any change in the Phone no's/email/postal address must be updated in the school records.
- 4. Remarks put down in the almanac should be seen and countersigned regularly.

5. Books/Notebooks should be sent as per the time table. Lunch box,water bottle and other necessary art/ crafts items must be sent along with child.

- 6. Ensure your ward complete home assignments on daily basis and prepares well for all the tests and examinations.
- 7. The student should be sent on time and in neat and clean school uniform.
- 8. The selection of age appropriate TV programme and their Time limit should be strictly monitored by the parents.
- Net Surfing by the children should be done under strict supervision and guidance of the parents. Children should not be part of Social Networking website.

10. Do not send your ward to school, if sick or not in good health to attend Classes or for tests.

11. In case a library books is damaged/lost by the child he/she will be penalized for the same.

Attendance

- 1. In case of withdrawal from the school, one month's advance notice in writing must be given to the school office.
- 2. Half day and short leaves are not granted. In case of emergency permission must be sought in writing from the Principal/Sup Incharge.
- 3. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than ten consecutive days renders the students liable to have his/her name struck off.
- 4. In case of illness/medical leave a medical certificates should be sent to the class teacher within 3 days of absence.

- 5. A child joining to school after suffering from an infectious disease should produce a fitness certificate from a doctor.
- 6. In case attendance is short the student will not be eligible for promotion/academic award.
- 7. It is mandatory the students to attend school till the last working day

The Discipline Norms

Cards will be given on the type of offense and shall be given as per the following steps:

STEP 1: Three verbal warnings properly documented by the teacher in the records and signed by the students with date.

STEP 2: Two warning cards (pink cards) issued by the teacher taking students signature.

STEP 3: Yellow card, If the case culminates to the level of a third warning card. A yellow card is to be issued by the coordinator only at the recommendation of the teacher.

STEP 4: RED Card, if the case culminates to the level of third yellow card. It will be issued by the principal on recommendation of the coordinator and on the approval of concerned supervisory head.

5.
