Summer Monsoon

1. Monsoon is a seasonal change in the direction of the prevailing, or strongest, winds of a region. Monsoons cause wet and dry seasons throughout much of the tropics. Monsoons are most often associated with the Indian Ocean.

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- 2. Monsoons always blow from cold to warm regions. The summer monsoon and the winter monsoon determine the climate for most of India and Southeast Asia.
- 3. The summer monsoon is associated with heavy rainfall. As winter ends, warm, moist air from the southwest Indian Ocean blows towards India. It usually happens between April and September in countries like India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, and Myanmar. The summer monsoon brings a humid climate and torrential rainfall to these areas.
- 4. India and Southeast Asia depend on the summer monsoon. Agriculture, for example, relies on the yearly rain. Many areas in these countries do not have large irrigation systems surrounding lakes, rivers, or snowmelt areas. The supplies of underground water, are shallow. The summer monsoon fills wells and aquifers for the rest of the year. Rice and tea are some crops that rely on the summer monsoon. Dairy farms, which help make India the largest milk producer in the world, also depend on the monsoon rains to keep cows healthy and well-fed.
- 5. When the summer monsoon is late or weak, the region's economy suffers. Fewer people can grow their own food, and large agri-businesses do not have produce to sell and government is bound to import food. Electricity becomes more expensive, sometimes limiting development to large businesses and wealthy individuals. The summer monsoon has been called India's true finance minister.

MANNERS AND ETIQUETTE

- 1. Etiquette and manners are both critical to functioning in society. While both of these concepts involve rules of behaviour, they are slightly different, and they involve different types of skills. They also vary from culture to culture, as standards of conduct are heavily based on cultural tradition and heritage. The primary distinction between etiquette and manners is that the first includes specific rules of conduct, while the other is more generalized. Manners involve general behavioural guidelines, such as treating the elderly with respect and courtesy whereas etiquette is a specific code of behaviour.
- 2. People are typically taught manners from a very young age, so that they grow up accustomed to the basic rules of conduct about appropriate behaviour in social situations. Children learn, for example, that it is not polite to stare, to make personal comments, or to criticize the selection of food at a dinner. In childhood, people usually absorb lessons about how to treat others and how to behave in a variety of situations. Manners often become second nature when they are taught at a young age.
- 3. In order to learn etiquette, people must take specific lessons, as opposed to learning by example or through gentle correction. Rather than learning general rules about how to behave at a dinner, someone would learn

specifically about which silverware to use and how to politely dispose of undesirable food items. Etiquette training also involves how to deal with introductions, and how to behave in numerous environments, from funerals to parties.
