KHMS Cares is an initiative set up to support Covid impacted families of the school. It is a commitment towards helping the affected children and their families rebuild their lives by alleviating suffering and maintaining human dignity during and in the aftermath of the pandemic. By providing this support, we wish to address children's critical needs and heal wounds. The initiative is a legacy that the school would leave behind for the future generations , imbibing within them the culture of uplifting others and seeking infinite strength in kindness.

Objectives:

1. Safeguard and secure the future of the children of the school who lost parents/parents due to Covid 19.
2. Ensure uninterrupted studies and academic progress for these children
3. Help compensate for loss of family member through emotional succour, mental well being
4. Make school a true second home and teacher a second mother for the impacted students.

Process of Organization

Identifying the impacted families by taking feedback from parents through a wellbeing form titled Form A



Online meetings to decide and organize the data received.



Asking for volunteers through volunteer forms sent to parents, teachers and alumni.



Online meetings for volunteers, seeking their inputs on the manner of donation - through time, money or in kind.



Application for support form filled by family members of the impacted children to understand the kind of support they required.



Providing required help in the form of fee waiver, emotional and academic support structure for the impacted children.

1. Financial
2. Emotional
3. Academic

1. Financial Support-

- Creating a pool of funds, by appealing to parents, teachers and alumni and associates of the school.
- The mode of deposit into a separate bank account being online transfer or cheques.

It was heartening to see whole hearted generous contributions.

- Necessary steps to study every case in its individuality and the particular requirements of the said case.
- Six months fee waiver to deserving cases.
- Further waiver linked to academic performance to keep the child motivated. A progressive performance would make the case eligible for next 6 months.

2. Emotional Support-

Wellbeing webinars and workshops to provide steps to emotional and mental stability.

Constant contact with Family members by mentors.

3. Academic Support Structure -

- Teacher mentors and shadow mentors who would keep in regular touch with the child and family so that child could regain the support lost and family members could also find a confidant in the mentor.
- Mentorship programme set up as per schedule to ensure the child keeps up the academic pace and receives all required support.

The process and initiative is an ongoing one and shall be continued beyond the covid era whereby school hopes to extend a helping hand and thus create a happy and healthy childhood and future infused with respect , dignity and equity for all
