### **SECTION A- READING (10 marks)**

### Q1. Read the passage given below.

- 1. John takes care of his teeth, hair, lungs, heart; he is hardly aware of my existence. I am John's liver. When he thinks of me at all, he has no trouble visualizing me. I look like what I am supposed to look like- liver. The largest organ in his body, I weigh three pounds. Protected by ribs, I pretty well fit the upper right part of John's abdomen. I am shaped like a cone.
- 2. Despite my unimpressive appearance, I am the most skilled among his organs. I hold about one pint (13%) of his blood supply at any given moment. I consist of two main lobes. Both are made up of eight segments that consist of one thousand lobules (small lobes). These lobules are connected to small ducts (tubes) that connect with larger ducts to form the common hepatic duct. The common hepatic duct transports the bile made by me to the gallbladder and duodenum (the first part of the small intestine) via the common bile duct.

3. In complexity I can shame those headline robbers, the heart and lungs, if they know that I do upwards of five hundred jobs, and if I fail in any of the major ones, John had better start making funeral arrangements. I participate in virtually everything that John does. I provide muscle fuel for his game of golf, digest his rich breakfast and manufacture the vitamin that helps his night vision. However, John's brain hesitates to inform him about all this.

4. A chemical company, which may boast of possessing the most advanced equipment, will have to build an enormous factory to do my simpler jobs. The harder ones it cannot do at all. I don't know if John will believe it or not, but I produce over one thousand organic chemical substances to handle his chemical conversions. John cuts his finger and might well bleed to death but for the clotting factors that I manufacture he is safe. I make antibodies that protect him from diseases. The protein fragments (amino acids) made in the intestine from that thick slice of meat he loves so much could be as deadly as cyanide if they ever go into the bloodstream. I 'humanize' them- change them from amino acids to human protein. And if there is any surplus that his body doesn't need, I change it into urea and pass it to the kidneys for excretion. (403 words)
